Dear Sir or Madam

The IV Conto Energia (D.M. May 5th 2011) requires the responsible of a photovoltaic installation to file a certification issued by the manufacturer of the photovoltaic modules that attests his membership in a European system or consortium which in turn guarantees the end-of-life management of these photovoltaic modules. It is mandatory in order to obtain incentives from the Italian Government in relation to those plants which will be operative after 30 June 2012,

The legislative provision refers to a European system. CERES is already active in every EU member state with over 100 members and we already fully comply with the D.M. May 5th 2011 requirements. We have issued and will continue to issue for our members a certificate attesting that they are members of CERES.

The new guidelines related to the IV Conto Energia issued on June 22nd, 2012, by the GSE and the Economy Ministry, also provide specific guidelines to be fulfilled by the system/consortia. While we understand the new guidelines represent a clarification over future legislative provisions and should not prevail on it, CERES will ensure its full compliance with it regardless of the changes requested.

We have already requested to be listed within the systems/consortium which fully or partially complies with the GSE requirements. We also declare to be available to fulfill every requirement with the instructions which the GSE would provide us in order to fully comply by December 2012.
